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**COMES NOW** the Iowa Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) and files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges against CVS/Caremark or Carelton Rx Mail (“Respondent”), pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.12(2) and 272C.3(1)(e), and 657 Iowa Administrative Code (“IAC”) 35.6 and 35.7.

**A. TIME, PLACE AND NATURE OF HEARING**

1. **Hearing.** A contested case hearing shall be held on June 25, 2025, before the Board. The hearing shall begin at 9:00 a.m. CT and shall be located in the conference room at the office of the Iowa Board of Pharmacy, 6200 Park Avenue, Ste. 100, Des Moines, Iowa 50321.
2. **Prehearing Conference.** A prehearing conference to schedule pre-hearing deadlines shall be held by telephone on May 28, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. CT before Administrative Law Judge Kimes-Schwiesow from the Iowa Department of Inspections, Appeals and Licensing (ALJ) at the following conference line, 866-822-2492. Board rules on prehearing conferences may be found at 657 IAC 35.22.
3. **Answer.** Within twenty (20) days of the date you are served this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges you may file an Answer. In that Answer, you should also state whether you will request a continuance of the date and time of the hearing.
4. **Filing of Pleadings.** Pleadings shall be filed with the Board at the following address: Iowa Board of Pharmacy, 6200 Park Avenue, Ste. 100, Des Moines, Iowa 50321, by email to

[amanda.woltz@dia.iowa.gov](mailto:amanda.woltz@dia.iowa.gov), or electronically using the Administrative Electronic Document Management System ([adminhearings.iowa.gov/efile/](http://adminhearings.iowa.gov/efile/)).

5. **Presiding Officer.** The Board shall serve as presiding officer at the contested case hearing, but the Board hereby delegates to an Administrative Law Judge from the Department of Inspections, Appeals and Licensing, the authority to make initial rulings on prehearing matters, and requests the administrative law judge be present to assist and advise the Board at hearing.

6. **Prehearing Conference.** Any party may request a prehearing conference to discuss evidentiary issues related to the hearing in accordance with 657 IAC 35.22.

7. **Hearing Procedures.** The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at 657 IAC 35.25. At the hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by legal counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for hearing, you must comply with the requirements of 657 IAC 35.23. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at the discretion of the Respondent.

8. **Prosecution.** The Office of the Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State) in this proceeding. Pleadings shall be filed with the Board and copies should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address: Lindsey L. Browning, Assistant Attorney General, Iowa Department of Justice, Office of the Iowa Attorney General, 1305 E. Walnut Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Des Moines, Iowa 50309.

9. **Communications.** You may not contact Board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, facsimile, in person or e-mail, about this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have notice and an

opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board and serve upon all parties in the case. ## **B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION**

10. **Iowa License.** Respondent maintains Iowa nonresident pharmacy license number 3456. Respondent's Iowa nonresident pharmacy license is active and will next expire on December 31, 2025. Respondent also maintains Iowa CSA-Business license number 1108453. Respondent's Iowa CSA-Business license is active and will next expire on December 31, 2025.

11. **Jurisdiction.** The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code § 155A.

12. **Legal Authority.** If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code § 155A and 657 IAC 36.1.

13. **Default.** The Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code § 17A.12(3) and 657 IAC 35.27.

## **C. STATEMENT OF CHARGES**

### **COUNT I**

14. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 36.6(3) with knowingly making misleading, deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent representations in the practice of pharmacy or engaging in unethical conduct or practice harmful or detrimental to the public. Proof of actual injury need not be established.

### **COUNT II**

15. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 36.6(29) for violating the pharmacy or drug laws or rules of another state while under the jurisdiction of that state. See also Iowa Code

155A.12

### **COUNT III**

16. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 36.6(30) for having a license revoked or suspended or having other disciplinary action taken by a licensing authority of this state or of another state, territory, or country for conduct substantially equivalent to any of the grounds for disciplinary action in Iowa. A copy of the record from the licensing authority taking the disciplinary action shall be conclusive evidence of the action. See also Iowa Code 155A.12.

### **COUNT IV**

17. Respondent is charged under Iowa Code 155A.23(1)(q) with distributing a drug or device to a patient without a prescription drug order or medication order from a practitioner licensed by law to use or prescribe the drug or device.

### **D. STATEMENT OF THE MATTERS ASSERTED**

18. **Practice Setting.** Respondent is an Iowa licensed nonresident pharmacy located in Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania.
19. **Allegations.** A short and plain Statement of the Matters Asserted (Statement) was reviewed and approved by the Board at the time this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges was filed. The Statement shall be furnished to Respondent as an attachment to this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. However, the Statement is not a public record pursuant to Iowa Code § 272C.6(4)(a).

### **E. SETTLEMENT**

20. This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. The procedural rules governing the Board's settlement process are found at 657 IAC 35.24. If you are interested in pursuing settlement of this matter, please contact the Assistant Attorney General identified above.

## F. PROBABLE CAUSE FINDING

21. On April 1, 2025, the Iowa Board of Pharmacy found probable cause to file this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges.
