**NOTICE OF HEARING AND
STATEMENT OF CHARGES**

COMES NOW the Iowa Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) and files this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges against Bradley James Gordon (“Respondent”), pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 17A.12(2) and 272C.3(1)(e), and 657 Iowa Administrative Code (“IAC”) 35.6 and 35.7.

A. TIME, PLACE AND NATURE OF HEARING

1. **Hearing.** A contested case hearing shall be held on June 25, 2025, before the Board. The hearing shall begin at 1:00 p.m. and shall be located in the conference room at the office of the Iowa Board of Pharmacy, 6200 Park Avenue, Ste. 100, Des Moines, Iowa 50321.

2. **Prehearing Conference.** A prehearing conference to schedule pre-hearing deadlines shall be held by telephone on May 22, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. before Administrative Law Judge Lockard from the Iowa Department of Inspections, Appeals and Licensing (ALJ) at the following conference line, 888-601-4725. Board rules on prehearing conferences may be found at 657 IAC 35.22.

3. **Answer.** Within twenty (20) days of the date you are served this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges you may file an Answer. In that Answer, you should also state whether you will request a continuance of the date and time of the hearing.

4. **Filing of Pleadings.** Pleadings shall be filed with the Board at the following address: Iowa Board of Pharmacy, 6200 Park Avenue, Ste. 100, Des Moines, Iowa 50321, by email to amanda.woltz@dia.iowa.gov, or electronically using the Administrative Electronic Document

Management System (adminhearings.iowa.gov/efile/).

5. **Presiding Officer.** The Board shall serve as presiding officer at the contested case hearing, but the Board hereby delegates to an Administrative Law Judge from the Department of Inspections, Appeals and Licensing, the authority to make initial rulings on prehearing matters, and requests the administrative law judge be present to assist and advise the Board at hearing.

6. **Prehearing Conference.** Any party may request a prehearing conference to discuss evidentiary issues related to the hearing in accordance with 657 IAC 35.22.

7. **Hearing Procedures.** The procedural rules governing the conduct of the hearing are found at 657 IAC 35.25. At the hearing, you may appear personally or be represented by legal counsel at your own expense. You will be allowed the opportunity to respond to the charges against you, to produce evidence on your behalf on issues of material fact, cross-examine witnesses present at the hearing, and examine and respond to any documents introduced at hearing. If you need to request an alternative time or date for hearing, you must comply with the requirements of 657 IAC 35.23. The hearing may be open to the public or closed to the public at the discretion of the Respondent.

8. **Prosecution.** The Office of the Attorney General is responsible for representing the public interest (the State) in this proceeding. Pleadings shall be filed with the Board and copies should be provided to counsel for the State at the following address: Lindsey L. Browning, Regan Hodina, and David Merchan, Assistant Attorneys General, Iowa Department of Justice, Office of the Iowa Attorney General, 1305 E. Walnut Street, 2nd Floor, Des Moines, Iowa 50309.

9. **Communications.** You may not contact Board members in any manner, including by phone, letter, facsimile, in person or e-mail, about this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. Board members may only receive information about the case when all parties have notice and an opportunity to participate, such as at the hearing or in pleadings you file with the Board and serve

B. LEGAL AUTHORITY AND JURISDICTION

10. **Iowa License.** Respondent maintains Iowa CSA-Individual registration number 1511052. Respondent's Iowa CSA-Individual registration is active and will next expire on June 30, 2026.
11. **Jurisdiction.** The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to Iowa Code § 155A and 124.
12. **Legal Authority.** If any of the allegations against you are founded, the Board has authority to take disciplinary action against you under Iowa Code § 155A and 657 IAC 36.1.
13. **Default.** The Board may enter a default decision or proceed with the hearing and render a decision in your absence, in accordance with Iowa Code § 17A.12(3) and 657 IAC 35.27.

C. STATEMENT OF CHARGES

COUNT I

14. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.13(1) for failing to ensure physical security controls be commensurate with the schedules and quantity of controlled substances in the possession of the registrant in normal business operation. A registrant shall periodically review and adjust security measures based on rescheduling of substances or changes in the quantity of substances in the possession of the registrant.

COUNT II

15. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.14 for failing to maintain ultimate accountability of controlled substances and records maintained at the registered location and for failure to have adequate policies and procedures in place to comply with this rule.

COUNT III

16. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.19(1) for failing to ensure the inventory record included the strength and dosage form of the substance.

COUNT IV

17. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.18 for failing to follow the rule for maintaining a perpetual inventory system for all Schedule II controlled substances, particularly with violating subsection 10.18(2) that requires certain information be included.

COUNT V

18. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.20 for failing to ensure accountability of Schedule III through V controlled substances through one or more of the measures identified in this rule.

COUNT VI

19. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 10.22 for failing to comply with the rules for disposing of controlled substances and maintaining records of the disposal.

COUNT VII

20. Respondent is charged under 657 IAC 36.6(28) for failing to create and maintain complete and accurate records as required by state or federal law or regulation or rule of the Board.

COUNT VIII

21. Respondent is charged under Iowa Code § 124.304(1)(d), specifically that the Respondent has committed such acts as would render their CSA registration inconsistent with the public interest.

D. STATEMENT OF THE MATTERS ASSERTED


22. **Practice Setting.** Respondent has an Iowa-CSA individual registration and practiced in Iowa during the time period relevant to these allegations.
23. **Allegations.** A short and plain Statement of the Matters Asserted (Statement) was reviewed and approved by the Board at the time this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges was filed. The Statement shall be furnished to Respondent as an attachment to this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges. However, the Statement is not a public record pursuant to Iowa Code § 272C.6(4)(a).

E. SETTLEMENT

24. This matter may be resolved by settlement agreement. The procedural rules governing the Board's settlement process are found at 657 IAC 35.24. If you are interested in pursuing settlement of this matter, please contact the Assistant Attorneys General identified above.

F. PROBABLE CAUSE FINDING

25. On April 15, 2025, the Iowa Board of Pharmacy found probable cause to file this Notice of Hearing and Statement of Charges.
